ANNUAL REPORT 2009-2010

SECTION - I

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has to discharge the duties and functions specified in Article 320 of the Constitution of India. The Commission is required to advise the Government on all matters relating to framing of recruitment rules, principles to be followed in making appointments and promotions and transfers from one service to another service, in respect of disciplinary matters affecting Government Servants and to conduct examinations for selection of candidates under direct recruitment to the State, Subordinate and Ministerial Services. The Commission conducts Departmental Examinations for Government Servants and also conducts the examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence for admission to the school run by the Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehra Dun.

9. Notification:-

The Commission advertised 24 Notifications comprising of 6,238 vacancies in respect of 69 posts. 6,53,892 Applications were received.

SECTION – II

DIRECT RECRUITMENT:

During the period under report the Commission finalised 32 recruitments containing 16,775 vacancies and recommended 16,206 candidates for appointments.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATIONS :

During the period under report, the Commission conducted one Preliminary examination for Group-I Services to fill up 82 Vacancies. 86,244 Candidates were admitted to this Preliminary Examination.

MAIN WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

During the period under report, the Commission conducted 21 Main Written Examinations to fill up 5,514 vacancies. 1,98,477 candidates were admitted to these Main Written Examinations.

ORAL EXAMINATION:

During the period under report, the Commission conducted Oral Test for 25 Recruitments to fill up 3995 vacancies. The Commission conducted interviews on 72 days. The Oral Tests were held in two sessions, one in the F.N. and the other in the A.N., a maximum of 7 Boards were constituted in both the sessions on some days, 7,413 candidates were admitted to Oral Test. Totally 950 Boards took place in 72 days for the current year.

SECTION – III

Paucity of Qualified and Suitable candidates:- There were paucity of qualified and suitable candidates for the post of Health Officer-2, Accounts Officer Class-III-18, Veterinary Assistant Surgeon & Junior Veterinary Assistant Surgeon-18, Combined Engineering Service -1, Assistant Electrical Inspector-2, Group-IV Services (Special Competitive Examination)-205. As a result 246 vacancies could not be filled up during this year.

RECRUITMENT BY TRANSFER / PROMOTION, DISCIPLINARY CASES, APPEALS, PETITIONS, STATUTORY RULES, REGULATION, TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS ETC.,

1. RECRUITMENT BY TRANSFER / PROMOTION:

During the period, the Commission dealt with references relating to recruitment by transfer to State Services from the corresponding Subordinate Services and by promotions within the State Services and drew up lists of 932 qualified and suitable candidates for appointment to the posts under 19 Services.

3. STATUTORY RULES, REGULATION, ETC.:

In 611 cases, the Commission's concurrence was sought for and given under the latter part of Regulation 16(b) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations 1954 for making appointment to the posts in the State, Subordinate and Ministerial Services.

In no case, the Commission has refused to accord such concurrence.

5. CONCURRENCE UNDER RULE 20(a) (iii) OF THE SPECIAL RULES FOR THE TAMIL NADU MINISTERIAL SERVICE.

The Commission accorded its consent under the provision in Rule 20(a)(iii) of the Special Rules of Tamil Nadu Ministerial Services for the permanent transfer of 34 personnel from one departmental unit to another departmental unit within the Tamil Nadu Ministerial Service and in no case, consent was refused.

6. PROMULGATION AND AMENDMENTS:

During the period under report, there were 51 cases of issue of statutory rules or amendments to them by the Government. Of them, in respect of 49 cases, the Commission was consulted before the rules were issued and in 2 cases the Commission was not consulted. However, these cases relate either to posts excluded from the purview of the Commission or to matters in respect of which under Article 320(3) of the Constitution of India, consultation with Commission is not necessary.

7. RELAXATION:

During the period under report, there were 47 cases in which statutory rules relating to age and educational qualifications as the case may be, were relaxed by the Government.

SECTION – V

OTHER THAN RECRUITMENT EXAMINATIONS

I. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION:

Departmental Tests were conducted in May and December 2009. The total number of tests conducted were 302 and the number of candidates applied to the tests were 1,42,350 .

II. HALF YEARLY EXAMINATION:

16 and 98 candidates appeared in September 2009 and March 2010 respectively. Half Yearly Examination including First Class Language Test in Tamil was conducted for Officers of Indian Administrative Service, Indian Police Service, Indian Forest Service and State services.

III. RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE SCHOOL, DEHRA DUN EXAMINATION:

The Commission conducted the Examination on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Defence in August 2009 and in February 2010 for selection of candidates for admission to the Rashtriya Indian Military College School in Dehra Dun. 78 and 172 candidates respectively appeared for the examination.
